Then there's the ubiquitous internet... While e-bay and other on-line auctions offer troves of collectibles, treading carefully is always the rule when you can't actually use your sense of touch and see an item up close to determine a genuine value.

So what other coin buying opportunities are there throughout the DC area? We did a little surfing and uncovered a few that sound worth exploring. Look them up on line to uncover some new coin buying opportunities!

Crumpton Auctions Crumpton, MD 410.928.3006

Crumpton Auctions are known throughout the DC metro area for their weekly furniture and consignment auctions, which can also feature jewelry and coins.

Jim Racine Auctioneers North East, MD 410.658.9720

Auctions are usually held every 2 or 3 weeks on Saturdays. The merchandise varies and can at times include coins, stamps, and military items.

Culpepper Auction Center Culpepper, VA

The Culpeper Auction Center specializes in high caliber furniture and collectibles. Coins are sometimes featured.

Hash Auctions Berryville, VA

Hash Auctions usually holds auctions on Mondays. They specialize in estate and consignment auctions which sometimes include coins.

Doyle New York Georgetown Office 202.342.6100

Doyle New York is based in New York City with an office in Washington DC. Doyle conducts about forty auctions per year, which include antiques, fine art and jewelry. Two NY-based auctions which feature coins are scheduled for 3/22-23, and 4/20.

Weschler's Auctioneers, Washington, DC 202.628.1281 Weschler's is the only auction

house located within DC and has been around for over 120 years. It holds about 6 catalog auctions per year, and on April 2, will hold an auction featuring coins, jewelry, and watches.

#### YN CORNER

January's issue included a section on collecting ancient coins. It featured an article on the use of ancient coins as propaganda, which is excerpted below.



Roman leaders used coins, along with statuary and other art forms, to make their physical im-

age familiar to the people of their expansive empire. They often took further advantage of the news-spreading power of coins, publicizing their victories and accomplishments on the reverses. Coins were an important tool of propaganda, in an age when few people would ever lay eyes on public figures.



A Sestertius of Trajan announces his completion of the Via Traiana Nova, a major new road. The

reverse depicts the reclining figure of Via Traiana, a personification of the roadway.



This Denarius of Septimius Severus bears his Triumphal Arch. It both announces the monument's completion, and further recognizes the victory it celebrates.





Nero is commonly known for his tyranny and extravagance as a leader, but he was highly concerned with his public image. The reverse of this coin shows him distributing charity to a citizen.

Trajan issued this As to celebrate his military triumph. The reverse shows one of the defeated Dacians kneeling at the feet of the goddess Victory.
