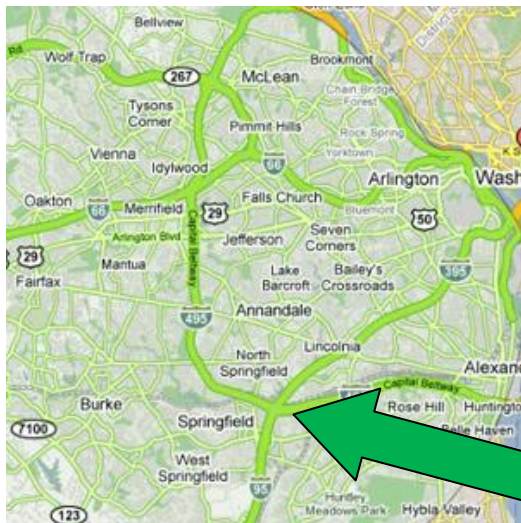

London 2012 Olympic 50P Commemorative Coins: *They're Popular!*



Circulating London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic 50p Commemorative Coins are pretty popular, according to new data from the Royal Mint.

The Royal Mint stated that it expects and plans for 2 to 3% of new 50p coins released into circulation to be removed – either by collectors or losses. But a recent audit suggests that of the 29,363,613 Sports 50ps issued into circulation to date, more than 70% will be hoarded by people who want to have a souvenir by the time the Olympic Games begin — 67% above the usual level of removal.

Almost 30,000 designs were submitted to the Royal Mint following the launch of a public competition in January, 2009. After months of debate and consultation the final 29 coin designs were chosen anonymously by a panel made up of independent experts, representatives of the Royal Mint, London 2012 and the International Olympic Committee.

The winning designs feature images of all the official Olympic sports of London 2012 such as Gymnastics, Sailing and Swimming, as well as Paralympic sports such as Boccia and Goalball. The winning designers came from a diverse range of professions and backgrounds including a police officer, a delivery driver, a radiologist, a bank clerk, and a part time chef. They ranged in age from an 8-year-old schoolgirl to a 75-year-old former social worker.
