## Red Kettles Bring Gold!



It's that time of the year again. And for some Salvation Army volunteer bell ringers, it's the most wonderful time as they discover gold has been anonymously dropped into their red kettles. As in years past, the generous act has been occurring in cities, towns, and suburbs across the country. So far this Christmas season, the Salvation Army has received a total of about 40 gold coins, left anonymously in their red kettles, among other valuable treasures such as currency and jewelry.

Salvation Army officials say about 400 gold coins have been found in red kettles over the past 30 years. Gold coins have recently been found in many states including lowa, New York, Indiana, Washington, Nebraska, Illinois, Texas, North Carolina and Florida. In our annual coverage of this golden tradition, we take a look into some of the exciting finds.

In an upstate New York shopping plaza in Horseheads, N.Y., an American Eagle gold coin was found. As a bonus, the coin was wrapped in a $\$ 100$ bill. An accompanying note read: This coin is solid gold and worth around $\$ 500$.
God Bless."


The Salvation Army Greater Houston Area Command has also received several gold coins during the 2012 season. A 1-ounce gold coin was wrapped inside of a $\$ 1$ bill with an accompanying note that read "A child is born, Jesus! Merry Christmas!"

In Almance County, North Carolina, Australian gold coins and a \$50 American Eagle gold coin were dropped into one of The Salvation Army's red kettles. The coins were appraised locally for about $\$ 1,700$.

A \$20 American Eagle gold coin was anonymously dropped into one of The Salvation Army's red kettles in Lee County, Florida. The coin was given for the
 eighth year in a row and wrapped in a note that read, "In loving memory of Mimi." Shortly thereafter, a unnamed donor dropped a 2012 Silver Eagle dollar coin into a red kettle in Bonita Springs, Florida. It was accompanied by a note that read "Inspired by: In Memory of Mimi donor..."

Another anonymous donor deposited a 1975 South African Krugerrand gold coin in a nearby red kettle. It was wrapped in a note that quotes the Bible verse I Chronicles 29: 14-16: "But who am I, and who are we, that we may offer as generously as this? For all things come from You, We are sojourners, tenants, stewards before Thee, as all our days are like a shadow...."

Gold coins discovered in Salvation Army Red Kettles in Chicago and surrounding suburbs have been a long tradition and are excitedly anticipated every season. The philanthropic tradition of dropping gold coins into Salvation Army kettles began in Chicago and dates back 24 years, when the first gold coin was deposited in McHenry County. This year, gold coins in the area are worth double their actual value. A generous anonymous
donor is matching the value of any gold coins found in Salvation Army Red Kettles throughout the Chicago Metropolitan Division up to 100 coins.


Chicago area bell ringers found their first gold coin of the season on December $2^{\text {nd }}$. It was a one-ounce solid gold Sooth African Krugerrand worth almost $\$ 1,800$. And gold was deposited for the first time ever in the south suburbs of Chicago this year. A one-ounce Canadian gold coin was dropped into a kettle in South Holland, Illinios. With an estimated value of $\$ 400$, the donation automatically rises to $\$ 800$ with the pledged match.

In Libertyville, Illinois, a Salvation Army kettle outside of a north suburban grocery store struck gold twice thanks to an extremely generous secret Santa. Seven more Swiss gold coins were found after the same thing happened at the same kettle a week earlier. The total donation of the coins is more than $\$ 6,900$ and the donor left a note saying "enclosed is a second identical donation to assist you in your Godly care of our neediest brothers and sisters. Trust me, these donations are small when compared to the bountiful blessings God has bestowed on us."

In Maquoketa, Iowa, Salvation Army officials have experienced their first kettle gold. Someone slipped in a \$50 Canadian Maple Leaf gold coin weighing one ounce outside of a Walmart. A $\$ 1$ bill was taped to the outside of the coin, which is valued between $\$ 1,600$ and $\$ 1,800$. In lowa City, lowa, volunteers discovered a $\$ 175$ gold coin. This is now the fifth year someone has donated a gold coin in one of the city's kettles. In Ankeny, lowa, volunteers celebrated when they found a silver bar worth more than \$34.

Not too far away, a different type of coin made an appearance. A $1 / 20$ of an ounce 2006 Gold Chinese Yuan was found in a Salvation Army red kettle in Southwest Omaha. The gold coin is worth an estimated $\$ 120.00$.


Someone secretly dropped a gold South African Krugerrand worth more than $\$ 1,600$ into a Salvation Army kettle in Kokomo, Indiana this December, marking the fourth straight year such a coin was found in a kettle in this central Indiana city.

And there's a person in Clarksville, Tennessee known as the Angel of Giving who drops a valuable gold coin into a Salvation Army kettle every year. The Salvation Army found this year's coin wrapped in an envelope tucked inside the kettle outside of a Sam's Club. It's estimated to be worth more than $\$ 1,700$.

In the Spokane, Washington, area, bell ringers found a one-ounce silver coin. It was wrapped in a note explaining that the donor had held onto it for 20 years. The person, apparently unemployed for more than a year, and facing foreclosure and bankruptcy, stated "I still know there are families in worse shape."

Other interesting donations so far this year, reported on the Salvation Army Blog:

- Thirty-six $\$ 100$ bills in a red kettle in Chattanooga, Tennessee
- A "dime-sized gold coin worth $\$ 200$ " in Coralville, lowa
- A half a troy ounce American Eagle coin worth about \$850, in Tyler, Texas
