SS Central America Site Reveals More Treasure



The SS Central America sank off the coast of South Carolina on Sept. 12, 1857, during a hurricane. SS Central America was bound for New York with 578 passengers and crew, and 38,000 pieces of mail, the *Central America* also held tons of gold ingots, coins, nuggets, and dust mined from the western gold fields.

Gold continues to be discovered at the SS Central America shipwreck site. During the operations conducted from April 15 to July 15, 2014, gold ingots with a face value (in 1857) of more than \$120,000 have been recovered. The past three months have also seen the recovery of more than 2,000 U.S. gold coins and over 11,500 silver coins, along with gold jewelry and kilograms of gold nuggets and dust.

Also found at the wreckage site of SS Central America was a large collection of ambrotype and daguerreotype photographs have also been discovered. The photographs of mid-19th century gold miners, some of whom may have perished in the sinking, are rare.

Did You Know?

PRESIDENT HARDING Approved the 1921 silver dollar design after what he perceived to be an extra "dimple" under Liberty's chin was removed. Earlier in the year, Harding had made

history by becoming the first presidentelect to ride to his inauguration in an automobile. Packard Twin Six supplied by the Republican National Committee. The Locomobile that Harding had driven



in his hometown of Marion Ohio, was eventually brought to the White House. But the official presidential car during his administration was a Pierce-Arrow.

COIN TRIVIA

Why does a silver dollar contained more silver than two silver halves or four quarters or l0 dimes?

Our US silver coins contain more than the face value in bullion. The Coinage Act of 1853 reduced the silver content of the minor coins by 6.91 percent but did not change the dollar's weight. Thus, the silver minor coins have a lower total bullion content than the amount in the silver dollars.

Guidelines for submitting coins for the monthly auction

When submitting coins for the monthly auction always try to use the printed club submission form. The club form lists the current submission rules. To conserve printing costs, take one or two blank forms and make addition copies as needed. Submit individual coins in a flip or 2x2 holder. Flatten the staples of a 2x2 holder

with pliers. This will protect your coins as well as the submissions of others from damage caused by the raised staples when coins are stacked for transporting. When completing the submission form always verify the date and mint mark on your coin. Coins submitted without a reserve minimum tend to sell for higher prices than submissions with a reserve that's close to the actual value.
